Our mission is to empower youth to develop the skills, resources and resilience needed to live independently.

Homelessness continues to be a difficult problem to solve. We work hard to empower and assist the young people who knock on our virtual doors. We prioritize flexible support to our clients through direct cash transfers. We also provide temporary housing at local motels when necessary to ensure the safety and well-being of youth participants.

Young adults are trusted to use the cash and electronic gift cards to meet their basic needs as they take steps to improve their situation, while we provide nonintrusive case management and optional supports.

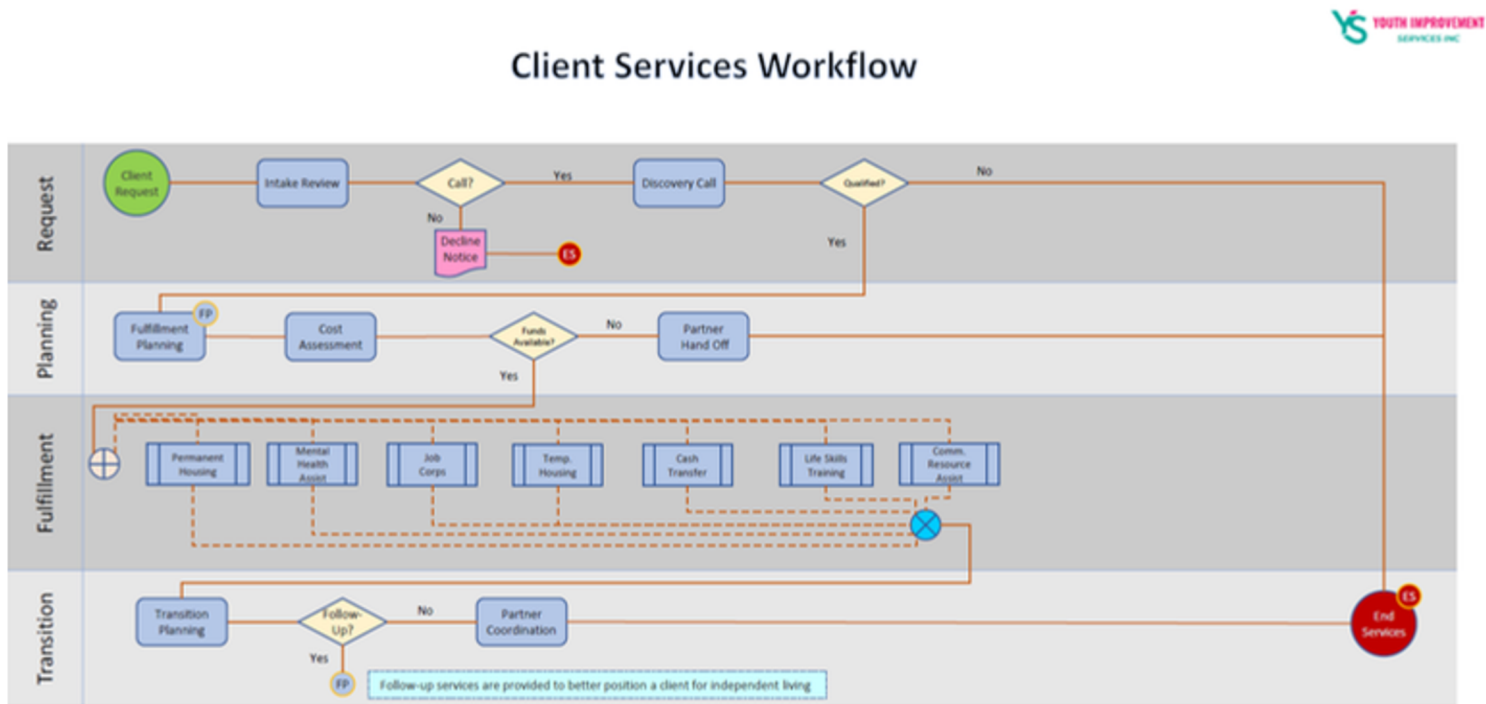


How We Help Young Adults

Our work with 18 to 24 year old youth is influenced by Chapin Hall's extensive research. We use evidence-based interventions to ensure the best possible outcomes with limited funds.

When young adults request assistance, we provide for their immediate safety, then connect them to community resources for access to transportation, employment, training, and healthcare. We also encourage them to reconnect with trusted relatives and friends. Helping youth to thrive is important because youth are the future of our community.
